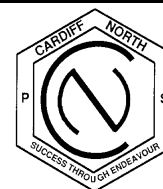

Principal's Message

We are almost there everyone! This is our second last Bulletin for the year. Christmas is fast approaching and I hope you are all surviving the lead up to the silly season.

As promised here is a snapshot of some of the positive results from our Tell Them From Me Surveys. Thank you so much to all of the families who contributed by completing our surveys.

In the student surveys 82% of students said they participated in extra-curricular activities at school, compared to the government norm of only 55%. 90% of our students said they value schooling and 84% of our students said they have positive relationships with their friends. Both of these were comparable with state results. 93% of our students said they try hard to succeed in their learning compared to 88% of the state. 89% of students said they display positive behaviours at school compared to 83% of the state.

The parent surveys were reported in mean or average scores out of 10. Parents scored the school supporting student learning as 7.9 compared to the state average of 7.3. Parents scored the school supporting positive behaviour at 8.2 compared to the state average of 7.7. Parents reported the school safety at 7.8, compared to the state of 7.4. Parents reported the inclusiveness of our school at 7.6, compared with 6.7 for the state.

The teacher surveys were also reported in mean or average scores out of 10. Teachers scored the leadership of the school as 7.7 compared to the state average of 7.1. Teachers scored the collaboration among staff as 8.5, compared to the state average of 7.8. Teachers scored the learning culture as 8.3, compared to the state average of 8.0. Teachers scored data informing our teaching as an 8.4, compared to the state of 7.8. Teachers scored their teaching strategies as 8.1, compared to the state average of 7.9. Teachers scored technology at 7.0, compared to the state average of 6.7. Teachers scored our school being inclusive at 8.7, compared to the state average of 8.2. Teachers scored parent involvement at 7.6 compared to the state average of 6.8.

While we are extremely proud of these results and that we are again pushing above the state in most areas, we are already planning on how we can improve on these results even further next year.

Early in Term 1, we will hold a parent survey forum where we will ask you to come and hear about our current initiatives and complete some mini surveys about them. It will be kind of like speed dating style and will replace the mini-surveys we intended to hand out this term as we think this is a better way to get to know all of your thoughts and give you the time you need to let us know what you think in person.
