Principal's Message

Kindergarten Orientation

While Kindergarten orientation remains on hold, our Kindergarten Orientation Team are meeting next week to plan for individual parent meetings via ZOOM, as an initial part of our revised program. It is envisaged that we will hold ZOOM meetings to deliver our Kindergarten Orientation program information after these initial meetings. Our Kindergarten Orientation team will publish our revised program in an upcoming Bulletin, as well as emailing it to any families currently enrolled for Kindergarten 2021.

School Photos

We have had several enquiries regarding school photos. At this stage school photos will go ahead on October 27th, unless advised otherwise. Whilst the packs will be sent to the school closer to this date, we are awaiting information from our photographer in regard to costing, so we can inform you of prices as soon as possible.

Unwell Students

During the COVID-19 pandemic, any student with symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste, and loss of smell), even mild symptoms, should not be at school and will need to provide a negative COVID-19 test prior to their return.

If, after testing negative, the student has ongoing symptoms which persist beyond 10 days, the student should arrange to see their doctor. The medical assessment should consider whether the symptoms are typical for that person (for example seasonal, allergic rhinitis), and provide documentation for the school if this is the case. If there are new symptoms at any time, the student should be tested again. Where a student is unwell with these symptoms at school arrangements will be made to send them home.





2020 Remote Learning Survey Results


1. Number of responses received: Responses represent 40 families and 58 students.

Responses represented each class, as outlined in the below table:



Findings:

- ♣ The survey represents 33% of the school community and a variety of stages and classes.
 - 2. Survey responders participated in a variety of home learning styles, as outlined below:




Findings:

Just over half of survey participants either participated in online learning or a mixture of both online and offline.

Future Directions:

♣ Both online and offline modes of learning need to continue to be developed if required in the future.

3. The below graph represents how survey participants best described the quality of weekly learning plans:




Findings:

Majority of survey participants (42%) viewed the quality of weekly learning plans as 'Very good'. 35% described the quality of learning plans as 'Excellent'.

Possible Future Directions:

- Survey results indicate a high level of satisfaction with weekly learning plans provided by all stages. This indicates the implementation of a successful format that can be continued to be used in the future if required.
- 4. The below graph represents how survey participants best described the quality of feedback provided by teachers:



Findings:

Majority of survey participants (47%) viewed the quality of feedback provided as 'Very good'. 17% described the quality of feedback provided as 'Excellent'.

Possible Future Directions:

- Survey results indicate a good level of satisfaction with teacher feedback provided by all stages. This indicates staff provided feedback to students and is something that is valued by parents and students.
- Continued PL focus on feedback.

5. Aspects of the remote learning program enjoyed by survey participants and their children:

Findings:

- Families enjoyed and found manageable tasks involving online learning platforms such as Matific, PM Readers online and story time.
- Families found value in Zoom meetings for both educational and social purposes
- Families appreciated a variety of activities and tasks being classified as 'must dos'
- Families enjoyed tasks that were link based and provided immediate feedback

Possible Future Directions:

- If required, continue to implement Matific activities, online story time and PM Readers online
- If required, implement regular zoom meetings for each class
- 4 If required, continue to classify tasks as 'must dos' to give families direction.

6. Aspects of the remote learning program survey participants and their children found challenging:


Findings:

- Some families found the workload to be heavy and difficult to manage at home. This was especially apparent for families where parents were working from home.
- Initial operation and understanding of online platforms and their associated passwords
- Families found it challenging to facilitate their children to work independently, especially during writing activities.

Possible Future Directions:

- If required, review of daily workload for all stages. Inclusion of student-centred activities that can be potentially be completed independently at home.
- If required, exploration of streamlining access to online platforms for families

7. The below graph represents the percentage of survey responders who received a check in call:




Findings:

- 4 95% of families reported receiving a check in phone call and majority of families found this to be a very helpful and supportive experience
- ♣ Some responses indicated a desire for check in phone calls to come from their child's teacher

Possible Future Directions:

If required, develop system for more regular phone call check ins from classroom teacher

8. The below graph represents the percentage of survey participants who would require technology to be loaned to them if home learning was required in the future:




Findings:

4 25% of survey participants indicated they would require a laptop to be loaned to them if remote learning was required in the future.

PossibleFuture Directions:

- ♣ If required, continue to implement student laptop loaning system.
- 9. The below graph represents the percentage of survey participants who participated in a Parent / Teacher phone interview in Term 2:



Findings:

- ♣ 67% of survey participants took part in parent/teacher phone interviews
- Families found the phone interviews valuable in understanding their child's progress at school

Future Directions:

- # If required, continue with phone interviews.
- 10. Feedback regarding modified Semester One reports:

Findings:

Families found the modified reports easy to follow and informative of their child's progress despite a period of remote learning.

Future Directions:

- If required, continue with modified version of academic reports
- Redesign regular report structure to incorporate personalised comments for English and Mathematics and content tick descriptors for other KLAs.


